Instructions for in-person worship.


It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everliving God.



Gender, Sexism and Justice Series:

The past year has given us many reasons to have conversation and study on gender, sexism and justice: the Atlanta Spa Shooting targeting Asian-American women, potential legislation regarding LGTBQ+ access and rights, and gender-based harassment on the rise in work-from-home situations.

Dr. Seth Dowland will situate us with a historical perspective on how Christians have grappled with issues of gender and justice, leading us into our contemporary context. Then MVLC pastors will lead us in a look at the ELCA Social Statement *Faith*, *Sexism and Justice: A Call to Action*.
