

None of the wicked shall understand, but those who are wise shall understand. 11From the time that the regular burnt offering is taken away and the abomination that desolates is set up, there shall be one thousand two hundred ninety days. <sup>12</sup>Happy are those who persevere and attain the thousand three hundred thirty-five days. <sup>13</sup>But you, go your way, and rest; you shall rise for your reward at the end of the days.



You who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time or ever before.


Come, you who have tried to follow and you who live with a sense of failure in your following.


