You who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time or ever before.


Come, you who have tried to follow and you who live with a sense of failure in your following.







Fundraising Meal for the Zahir Family

THIS morning immediately after worship Life Together Hall

Mountain View Lutheran Church has been walking closely with an Afghan refugee family of six. The Zahir family is Muhammad, Qodbia, and their four school-age children. Muhammad was a doctor in Afghanistan working with Doctors Without Borders. Our church is walking closing with this family because Gene and Karen Quandt opened up their Edgewood home for several weeks and Pat Clement, a neighbor of the Quandts, became a champion for the Zahir family, providing transportation and help getting drivers licenses, signing up for ESL classes, and navigating the enrollment of their kids in school.

The Zahir family needs a vehicle because right now they have no transportation except for walking. So, our church is hosting an Afghan Meal that will be cooked by the Zahir family and supported by Mountain View friends. A free-will donation will be taken to raise money for a vehicle. A generous donor has already given \$5,000 to be used as matching dollars for this family in need. So, our goal with this meal is to turn \$5,000 into \$10,000.

Muhammad Zahir will share the story of his family in Afghanistan and their journey to America. Please invite your friends, neighbors, and family members that you feel would like to support the Zahir family building a life in our community.
