
DISTRIBUTION

If gluten-free wafers are required for health reasons, then please ask the pastor serving communion for a wafer.





- "Christ Pantocrator Transfiguration," artificial intelligence "dream" using Wombo Art AI, 2023, by Troy Kehm-Goins. Using the oldest known image of "Christ Pantocrator" as a minor influence, the phrase "Christ Pantocrator Transfiguration," and the "ukiyo-
- In some initial "dreams," the AI interpreted the Bible that Christ holds in the original image as a building. A church perhaps? This was the best "dream," however, because of the way that it captures the text of the biblical passage of the Transfiguration on the canvas. The figure of Christ is transfigured into the landscape of the "high mountain" (17:1) and cradles the disciples "overcome by fear" (17:6) in his embrace. "His face shone like the sun" (17:2) over the entire scene.
