ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission with Michael Ray and Beckah Selnick.

The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program invites ELCA young adults ages 21-29 into a transformative, year-long journey in international service. They share in the journeys of companion churches and organizations in one of nine countries around the world. Michael and Beckah will share their experiences as YAGMs and how the program has had an ongoing impact on their lives.

“Faith and Christian Nationalism” with PLU Professor Seth Dowland.

This three-week series will investigate the historical roots of Christian nationalism. We'll look at the ways white Christians defended white supremacy in the decades after the Civil War, the bitter debates about gender and sexuality that roiled the church in the late twentieth and early twenty-first centuries, and contemporary expressions of Christian nationalism. Understanding the roots of our divisions is an essential step in addressing them. Come join us as we explore this history, and think together about how to move forward as a church and as a nation.

Seth Dowland is Associate Professor of Interdisciplinary Studies at Pacific Lutheran University, where he teaches classes on American Christianity, religion and politics, and gender, sexuality, and race. He is author of *Family Values and the Rise of the Christian Right* and has published extensively on the history of American evangelicalism. Seth and his wife, Ami Shah, can usually be found chasing their 6-year-old and 3-year-old daughters around north Tacoma.
