We gather in the name of the redeemer, our Savior Jesus Christ,



You who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time or ever before.


Come, you who have tried to follow and you who live with a sense of failure in your following.

Please come. Receive the gifts of God for all the people of God.


LAMB OF GOD • "LAMB OF GOD"




